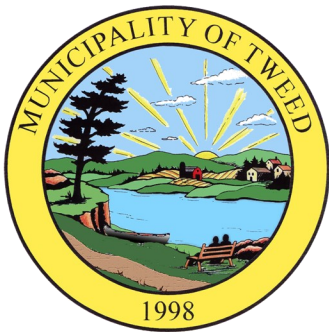

Central Hastings Public Transit

The Central Hastings Public Transit System is an initiative of the Central Hastings Support Network to provide a means for the general public of Central Hastings to travel within the local area in order to gain and maintain employment, further their education, obtain health care, attend to personal business, and expand their social networks.

If you live in Tweed and do not have a car to get to the surrounding areas the Central Hastings Transit system is your vehicle to overcome this obstacle. The bus holds 17 people, with 2 accessible seats with wheelchair lift access.

The Phase 1 Route travels through the three municipalities of Centre Hastings, Marmora and

Lake and Stirling-Rawdon into the City of Belleville.

The Phase 2 Route passes through Madoc Township and the Municipality of Tweed into the City of Belleville.

Depending on where you are travelling from, different fares are available for Adults, Students, Seniors, Children 6 to 11, and Children 5 and under. Monthly Passes are also available. The rates for Monthly Passes are the same for Adults, Seniors and Students.

In Tweed pick up is in front of the Tweed Legion Monday-Friday at 7:30 am, 11:30 am & 4:15 pm. In Thomasburg at the corner of Thomasburg Rd. & Clare St. at 7:40 am, 11:40 am & 4:25 pm. There is also pick up in Actinolite based on demand.

Buses return with arrival times of 9:25 am, 1:25 pm & 6:05 pm in Thomasburg and 9:35 am, 1:35 pm & 6:15 pm at the Tweed Legion.

**Municipal Act
Amendment Tax
Arrears**

Please be advised that in 2017 Section 373 (1) of the Municipal Act, 2001 was amended as follows: “Where any part of tax arrears is owing with respect to land in a municipality on January 1st in the second year following that in which the real property taxes become owing, the Treasurer of the Municipality, unless otherwise directed by the Municipality, may prepare and register a tax arrears certificate against the title to that land.”

This amendment means that municipalities may now register tax arrears certificates against a property on January 1 when a property has accumulated two years of tax arrears as opposed to the three-year limitation in the older version of the Act.

Purchase Dog Tags By March 31st

Municipality of Tweed By-Law No. 2014-07 requires that every owner of a dog, register and licence their dog each year.

Tags are \$15.00 per dog until March 31st. The price increases to \$45.00 per dog on April 1st.

Dog tags are available in the Municipal Office at

255 Metcalf Street, Tweed.

The by-law does include a fine for not having a current dog tag affixed.

The by-law permits up to three (3) dogs at any one residence.

A Kennel Licence is required for more than three dogs. Kennel licences are not permitted in the Village or Hamlets, or on

any Rural Residential zoned properties.

The Animal Control Officer issues all kennel licences and can be reached at 613-478-3547. The Tweed Animal Shelter is located at 139 Allore Road, Tweed.
