OPEN AIR BURN PERMITS

The Municipality of Tweed would like to remind residents that permits are required for any Open Air Burning.

Due to the extremely dry weather conditions this summer, it is important to take safety precautions when burning outdoors. Burning conditions are posted on our website **www.tweed.ca** and a notice of any burning bans will also be posted. **When a Burn Ban is in place there is absolutely no burning permitted.**

Residents are reminded that any large open air burning is to be called in to the Fire Department before AND after the fire. Please call 613-391-8857 prior to starting your fire.

Burn permits are available for purchase at the Municipal Office Monday-Friday 8:30 a.m.— 4:30 p.m. **The cost is \$10.00.**

NEW- You may also purchase burn permits at the Tweed Public Library on Saturdays from 10:00 a.m.—3:00 p.m.

Residents are reminded that there is absolutely no smoking on recreation properties.

Crookston Road Project-Fall 2016

The Ontario Community Infrastructure Funding program provides steady, long-term funding for small, rural and northern communities to develop their infrastructure.

The Municipality of Tweed received 80% funding from the Province of Ontario to complete the work necessary to enhance the entire Crookston Road within the Municipality of Tweed. The total project will cost \$1.8 Million.

Since 2014, the Province of Ontario provides funding for infrastructure projects based on how well a project fits into a comprehensive Municipal Asset Management Plan. The Crookston Road was highlighted as an arterial road with high priority as it is a connecting road between two Provincial highways.

The Crookston Road will be replaced with a new layer of asphalt, which will include realigning of the road to ensure its safety. The Crookston Road Project also includes funding for partial widening of the road for new bike lanes on both the north and south sides of the road from the Village of Tweed to Rapids Road. The two new bike lanes will allow cyclists to explore the beautiful countryside of the municipality, as well as connect with the Eastern Ontario Trails network to create a cycling loop for those looking to tour the area by bicycle.
